And finally, Leadership Communication Is a Discipline that Needs To Be Practiced.

When it is done well it looks effortless, like the athletes in the Olympic Games.
What we didn't see were the hundreds of

thousands of times of practicing behind.

To become an all-star communicator, you must **practice communicating skillfully,** and this practice must become a discipline So PRACTICE! Just that

Listen First: Then Speak

- you have to listen empathically AND
- To seek to understand the other person's perspective **first, before offering your solution.**
- You will need touch points. What is this? For instance, if the person mentions that he/she used to work in Winnipeg, you can mention, after, that you went to college there.

All the touch points you can get will demonstrate that you are actively listening and you care about it.

Let's start with a question.

Do you think leaders should be good communicators?

But this can't be an illusion for leaders. While communicating they must ensure that there would be no chance of any kind of miscommunication or misunderstandings. At least great leaders do. So, what kind of leader do you want to be?
